- 2. While the required number of course/credits is high, the program overlaps with other requirements for various majors or minors and the college core requirements. For example, many of the courses listed above will fulfill the student's Humanities (H), Social Science (SS), Diversity, (DN), Global Studies (GN) and even laboratory science (S) and Q-course requirements (Q).
