- Students who enter with Advanced Placement credit in U.S. History or American Government should substitute another History or Politics course in their required course sequence, if their schedule permits. Completing either of these requirements through CLEP tests is not recommended.
- While the required number of course/credits is high, the program overlaps with other requirements for various majors or minors and the college core requirements. For example, many of the courses listed above will fulfill the student's Humanities (H), Social Science (SS), Diversity, (DN), Global Studies (GN) and even laboratory science (S) and Q-course requirements (Q).

To enroll in Education 443, which leads to student teaching, a student must have a minimum overall GPA of 3.0, an Education GPA of 3.0 and a 2.67 GPA for courses in their major and passing scores for the PAPA or CORE\* exams.
